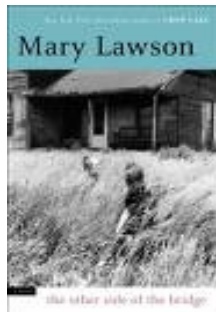

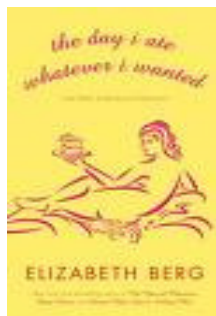
The Other Side of the Bridge by Mary Lawson
